SPF - NPCC BADGE PRESENTATION

The SPF-NPCC Badge is the pinnacle NPCC award badge that was launched in April 1997 to give recognition to outstanding cadets with good leadership qualities. This year, 155 cadets from 36 NPCC school units were awarded the prestigious SPF-NPCC Badge.

7 outstanding cadets from our school were recognised for their good leadership qualities and awarded the pinnacle award for NPCC cadets in 2009. This award is only awarded to the top 2% of the entire NPCC cohort in Singapore. They were selected from a total of 548 nominations from 155 school NPCC units.

On 3rd April 2009, 7 cadets and Mrs Jamie Chia attended the SPF-NPCC Badge Presentation Ceremony at Victoria School. The Guest-of-Honour was Senior Assistant Commissioner of Police, Ang Hak Seng, Senior Director for Planning and Development, Planning and Organisation Department, Singapore Police Force.

Cadets must have attained at least 10 badges, taken part in national competitions, organised events at unit level, school level or national level and must display exemplary character in order to achieve this award.



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SHORT FILM COMPETITION 'LIVING WITH DEMENTIA'

Many young people like us may not be familiar with the term 'dementia'. It is a medical condition that commonly affects the elderly and is considered part of the aging process. 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GLOBAL VENTURES

INTEGRATED IMMERSION PROGRAMME TO PHILIPPINES

From 10-14 March 2009, 3 teachers and 30 pupils from the Craft and Tech Department embarked on a 5-day educational trip to the University of the Philippines Integrated School.

The objectives of this programme were:

- To forge partnership ties and collaboration with top colleges in Philippines in the area of Art, Design and Technology and Food and Nutrition;
- To widen our teachers' and pupils' horizon by exposing them to different types of school environments and systems in Philippines;
- To inculcate appreciation of Philippines culture, values, architecture, people and way of life;
- To develop self reliance, independence and adaptability; and
- To inculcate team spirit of care, respect and tolerance among pupils through experiential learning.

For the 12 Art pupils, this trip to Philippines was an enriching learning experience. On the second day of the trip, we visited the Art Department in the University of the Philippines Integrated School (UPIS) and attended an art lesson conducted by Professor Anton del Castillo on a special Spanish technique, Estofado painting. Our pupils learnt more about the process of creating an Estofado Painting using gold or silver leaf on a wooden panel. They also had a memorable experience producing impressive and creative art pieces during the hands-on session.

The visit to Jorge B. Vargas Museum and Philippine Research Center was indeed an eye-opener for our pupils. They learnt that scientific means of detecting oil on canvas paintings can help in art authentication and preventive conservation.

On the third day, we visited the College of Fine Arts at UPIS, Diliman, Quezon city. Our pupils had a tour around the college and interacted with the students there. They were impressed with the art demonstration on Intaglio print, which is a form of printmaking.

At the Cultural Centre of the Philippines (CCP), students were greeted by a large number of beautiful murals and wall sculptures which were found at the lobby and entrance to the CCP. There was a special section for contemporary art located at the Painting and Sculpture Hall, where the pupils had the rare opportunity to view paintings completed by 13 prize-winning artists.

All in all, the trip was an interesting learning journey for our pupils. They were exposed to different techniques of art and they forged friendships with the schools we visited. Through our visits to the various schools and learning institutions, our pupils were able to appreciate the culture, people and way of life in the Philippines. The trip had also cultivated teamwork, independence and adaptability in the pupils through experiential learning.

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For the Food and Nutrition Unit, it was also a hands-on learning experience for the 10 F & N pupils on the way Filipinos prepared their indigenous dishes.

On the second day, our hosts shared some snacks popular among youngsters - homemade pizza and nachos, a Mexican snack. The food was easy to prepare using convenient ingredients available in the market. Our pupils enjoyed the tasty snacks.

On the third day, the pupils learned how to prepare a local dish - Gabi Chips (Yam Chips). The yam was cut into strips, soaked in iced water, and then deep fried. Cheese powder was sprinkled before serving. In the afternoon, the pupils visited the Pilot Food Plant at the College of Home Economics. It is a laboratory where canning, bottling, drying, food preservation and processing are conducted. The equipment used were shown and explained to the pupils. The laboratory is also used for research studies on sensory evaluation of food. Testing of food quality before marketing the product is also conducted there.

The interesting F & N lessons conducted in a different culture and tradition were an eye-opener for the pupils.



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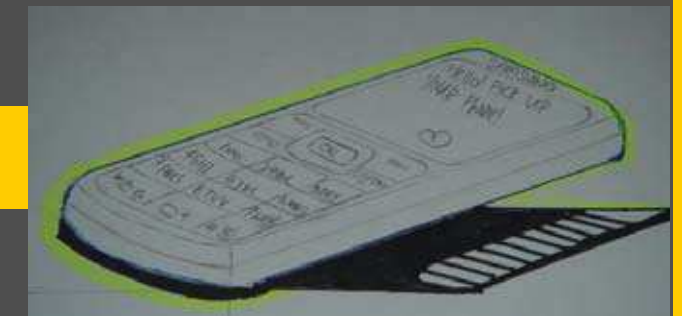
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The Design and Technology pupils attended a lesson on electricity and learnt how to connect the various circuitries. They were able to interact with their local counterparts and work on the project assigned to them. They also attended sketching sessions that enabled them to do presentation drawing of product design. The pupils were also given a lesson on how to use graphical illustration to communicate their product design.

As part of the exchange programme, they also visited the Department of Mechanical Engineering and were introduced to the various mechanical measurement and testing equipment.

W4 AsceNT@Yunnan

In Nov 2008, 7 pupils from 3NT were selected to be part of the AsceNT@W4 overseas education experience which was organised by Hong Kah Secondary School. A total of 35 students and 5 staff from Bukit View Secondary School, Hong Kah Secondary School, Hua Yi Secondary School, Jurongville Secondary School and Yuan Ching Secondary School went on this trip. It was held over a period of eight days from 6th to 13th November 2008 at the capital city of Kunming in Yunnan, China. Academic Partners of this project include Yunnan University, Yunnan Provincial Tourism School and Factor Learning Pte Ltd.

The W4 AsceNT@Yunnan is part of the AsceNT@W4 Cluster's effort to specially tailor programmes that enhance the learning experience of Normal (Technical) students by engaging them through various learning platforms and beyond-classroom experience.

The trip comprised an Academic Component and a Cultural Immersion Component. The Academic Component focuses on giving pupils an insight into the Tourism Service sector through a programme at the Yunnan Provincial Tourism School (YPTS). Pupils underwent a variety of learning activities including seminars, authentic learning sessions, presentations, field trips, learning journal entries, and reflections.

The Cultural Immersion component included a seminar on Traditional Chinese Medicine, workshops on Chinese Painting and Chinese Tea Art, and a field trip to the Stone Forest. Pupils and teachers interacted with their local counterparts through common meals and games. Besides YPTS, some of the seminars and workshops were conducted at the Yunnan University (YNU).

At the end of the trip, pupils were awarded certificates by both the Yunnan Provincial Tourism School and Yunnan University.

Despite a tiring day at Sentosa, all classes were determined to win the Best Class Award. Parents were invited to the camp-fire to show their children support. At the end of the night, all classes were given prizes for their efforts, with 1T1 emerging the winner of the Best Class Award.
